Areas to be inspected shall include, but are not limited to, equipment and material handling; storage; tank farms; equipment fueling; maintenance and cleaning; loading/unloading; process areas; and where spills have occurred in the past. These areas shall be checked for evidence of pollutants entering the drainage system and also identify conditions which may give rise to contamination of storm water runoff.</p> <p>The inspection must evaluate whether the SWPPP adequately minimizes pollutant loadings and is properly implemented in accordance with the terms of this permit or whether additional control measures are needed. This includes observing storm water discharges for obvious industrial storm water pollution such as color, lack of clarity, floating solids, settled solids, suspended solids, foam, odor and oil sheens.</p> <p>If feasible, the inspections should be conducted during or after storm events. As part of the inspection, storm water should be collected in a clean, clear jar and examined in a well lit area. All training records shall be maintained for at least three years from the date of training.

Training Program Requirements:

The permittee shall develop and implement a program for initial and periodic refresher training of personnel that are responsible for implementing and/or complying with the requirements of this permit. Initial training for all personnel that are responsible for implementing and/or complying with the requirements of this permit shall be performed within twelve (12) months of issuance of this permit.
