The above referenced facility has coverage under the previous general permit which expired on January 31, 2014. The Permit Board on Environmental Quality reissued the Dry Litter Poultry Animal Feeding Operation (DLPAFO) General Permit (MSG20) on February 3, 2014. This General Permit authorizes the operation of a dry litter poultry animal feeding operation as well as air emissions associated with the construction and operation of mortality incineration equipment. The reissued general permit contains several changes from the previous permit. A summary of some of these changes is attached.

A dry litter poultry animal feeding operation that wishes to apply for re-coverage under this general permit should carefully read the summary of the changes and the general permit which are located on our MDEQ website at:

Re-Coverage: To apply for re-coverage, the coverage recipient must complete the enclosed DLPAFO Notice of Intent (NOI) and send it to the address indicated by February 28, 2014. A current Nutrient Management Plan (NMP) must be on file at MDEQ. As explained in the DLPAFO NOI Instructions, there may be other submittals required.

Termination: Termination of the coverage may be requested by submitting a written request of termination to our office, but **ONLY** if a dry litter poultry operation no longer exists at this location.

If you have sold your dry litter poultry farm then you must provide our office with a phone number and mailing address for the new owner and forward this letter to them. If operation of a dry litter poultry animal feeding operation is ongoing and the farming operation does not obtain re-coverage, then you and/or the new owners will be operating without a valid permit and both will be subject to potential enforcement action. Summary of Changes Made

1. Construction storm water coverage has been removed from the Dry Litter Poultry General Permit. New construction will have to comply with the Construction Storm Water regulations. For construction disturbing 1 - 5 acres, the Small Construction Storm Water rules will apply. For construction disturbing 5 or more acres, the applicant must submit the Large Construction Notice of Intent and a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan to obtain coverage under the Large Construction Storm Water General Permit. Contiguous Landowner Notification is still applicable in either case.
2. Page 6 of 31. Language has been added, L-1 Adequate Storage.
ADEQUATE STORAGE:
Waste removed from the houses shall be stored until it can be applied according to the Comprehensive Nutrient Management Plan. Waste may be stored in a structure, or outdoors in a well-drained area away from floodplains, Waters of the State, and other water bodies. See definition of "Water of the State" in ACT 5 Condition T-23. The piles shall not be exposed to direct rainfall or stormwater. [11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 6, R. 1.1.4.A(4).]
3. Page 7 of 31. Language has been added, L-6 Discharge Prohibition.
DISCHARGE PROHIBITION:
Dry litter facilities shall have no discharge of process wastewater or contaminated stormwater. All clean runoff water will be diverted away from poultry houses and waste storage structures. [11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 6, R. 1.1.4.N(2)(a).]
4. Page 7 of 31. Language has been added, L-7 Land Application Requirements.
LAND APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:
The Permittee shall implement an approvable Comprehensive Nutrient Management Plan. [11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 6, R. 1.1.4.N(2)(b).]
5. Page 9 of 31. R-1 Land Application Recordkeeping has been amended. Removed the method and equipment used to apply litter and expected crop yields.
6. Page 10 of 31. R-4 Mortality Handling, kept language to record on our form, but added language that the Company mortality forms can be used in place of ours.
MORTALITY HANDLING:
Records of mortality management and practices used must be documented on Appendix F of the Dry Litter Poultry Forms Package. The permittee may use Company mortality forms in place of Appendix F. The forms must be maintained on site or locally available for a period of five years from the date they are created and made available to the Permit Board upon request. Mortalities must be disposed in accordance with all applicable requirements as set forth by the State Board of Animal Health. Mortalities must not be disposed of in any liquid manure or process wastewater system, and must be handled in such a way as to prevent the discharge of pollutants to surface water. [11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 6, R. 1.1.4.A(4).]
7. Inspection and Corrective Action Requirements have been removed from record-keeping.
8. Page 27 of 31. Language has been added, L-1 and L-2.
The incinerator must be operated in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. [11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 2, R. 2.2.B(10).]
Only chicken carcasses produced at the facility are permitted for incineration. Incineration of all other waste is prohibited. [11 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 2, R. 2.2.B(10).]
9. Page 29 of 31. Record-Keeping Requirements, R-2 has been amended. Removed temperature and start time.
