## AGREED ORDER

COME NOW the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality (Commission), acting through the staff and Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), Complainant, and MTD Products Inc., Respondent, in the above captioned cause and agree as follows:

1.

By letter dated October 20, 2015, Respondent was contacted by Complainant and notified of the following violations of Water - Pretreatment Permit No. MSP090126, at its facility located at 5484 Highway 145 South, Verona, Mississippi in Lee County:

- A. The September 2015 Total Recoverable Copper daily maximum concentration of 0.231 mg/l exceeded the permit limit of 0.21 mg/l by 10%.
- B. The September 2015 Total Recoverable Copper monthly average concentration of 0.231 mg/l exceeded the permit limit of 0.13 mg/l by 78%.

By letter dated February 17, 2016, Respondent was contacted by Complainant and notified of the following violations of Water - Pretreatment Permit No.MSP090126, at its facility located at 5484 Highway 145 South, Verona, Mississippi in Lee County:

C. The December 2015 Total Recoverable Copper daily maximum concentration of

0.746 mg/l exceeded the permit limit of 0.21 mg/l by 255%.

The December 2015 Total Recoverable Copper monthly average concentration of D.

0.746 mg/l exceeded the permit limit of 0.13 mg/l by 474%.

The December 2015 Total Recoverable Copper monthly average loading of

0.119 lb/day exceeded the permit limit of 0.11 lb/day by 8%.

By letter dated April 5, 2016, Respondent was contacted by Complainant and notified of the following violations of Water - Pretreatment Permit No. MSP090126, at its facility located at

5484 Highway 145 South, Verona, Mississippi in Lee County:

 $\mathbf{E}_{-}$ The February 2016 Total Recoverable Copper monthly average concentration of

0.192 mg/l exceeded the permit limit of 0.13 mg/l by 48%.

ŀ. In violation of permit condition S-2 (on page 3) the Discharge Monitoring Report

for February 2016 was received three days late on March 31, 2016. It was due not

later than March 28, 2016.

By letter received on April 11, 2016, Respondent alleged to have implemented measures

that have resulted in a return to compliance with the applicable regulations.

2.

In lieu of a formal enforcement hearing concerning the violations listed above,

Complainant and Respondent agree to settle this matter as follows:

Respondent agrees to pay and Complainant agrees to accept a civil penalty in the A.

amount of \$13,500.00. Respondent shall pay this penalty to MDEO within forty-

five (45) days after this Agreed Order has been executed by the MDEQ Executive

Director. The settlement payment shall be submitted to:

The parties further agree that Complainant continues to assert that Respondent's acts and/or omissions constitute violations of applicable environmental laws, regulations and permits.

Nothing in this Agreed Order shall limit the rights of MDEQ or the Commission in the event Respondent fails to comply with this Agreed Order. The Agreed Order shall be strictly construed to apply to those matters expressly resolved herein.

4.

Nothing contained in this Agreed Order shall limit the rights of MDEQ or the Commission to take enforcement or other actions against Respondent for violations not addressed herein and for future violations of environmental laws, rules, and regulations.

5.

Respondent understands and acknowledges that it is entitled to an evidentiary hearing before the Commission pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 49-17-31, and that it has made an informed waiver of that right.
