The Environmental Permits Division has approved the transfer of the requested stormwater permit coverage for the above referenced facility from Joel Stark Coleman to Lan Farms, LLC. Enclosed is a Certificate of Coverage granting you coverage under the Mining Storm Water, Dewatering, and No Discharge General Permit. Please note the limitations, schedules of compliance, monitoring requirements, and monitoring reporting dates found in the general permit are still applicable. The Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) appears to meet permit requirements and will be further reviewed during compliance inspections.

If you are required to submit DMRs please take advantage of our electronic Discharge Monitoring Reports (*e*DMR) program. This secure web-based program enables facilities to submit their DMRs electronically instead of by mail. An important condition that is often overlooked is the requirement to request termination of coverage once the project has been completed and stabilized. Failure to submit the "request for Termination of Coverage" form is a permit violation and subject to enforcement action.

#### ADDENDUM

The following is a summary of changes from the previous Mining Storm Water, Dewatering, and No Discharge General Permit. These changes reflect EPA requirements and regulations, clarify existing language, requirements and conditions, and contain measures to reduce administrative burden. The changes are listed in no particular order.

This is a summary and does not cancel the need for the coverage recipient to carefully read and be familiar with the general permit and its conditions.

- Several allowable non storm water discharges have been added. They are: waterline flushing, landscape irrigation, diverted stream flows, dust suppression water and vehicle washing where detergents are not used (Activity 2).
- An annual submittal of the monthly inspections is now required, rather that the semi-annual submittal required by the previous permit (Activity 8).
- Employee training (specifically how to stay in permit compliance) is now a requirement (Activity 13).
- New requirements for the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP):
  - Construction exits are required if trucks are leaving the mining site and moving directly onto a paved, public road.
  - Sedimentation basins must have a surface discharge.
  - Housekeeping practices require spill and leak response and clean up procedures and construction/mining equipment should have exposure to storm water minimized (Activity 5).
- Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) language has been up-dated and 303(d) language has been added (Activity 2).
